PETROPAVLOVSK-KAMCHATSKIY CITY TOUR

Duration: 3 hours

Indicative Price: US\$174 per person

Transport: Walk **Grade:** Easy

Description: City tour of Petropavlovsk-Kamchatskiy, including Regional Museum

During this excursion in Petropavlovsk-Kamchatskiy you will visit a number of important historical and cultural monuments including the main historical museum. The city, founded over 260 years ago, has an exciting and diverse history. Through exhibits at the museum you will learn about famous sea explorers such as Vitus Bering, La Perouse and Charles Clerke. At the Kamchatka Regional Museum of Local Lore you will gain an understanding of the natural history of the peninsula, exploration of the area and the lives of native people. You will also enjoy stunning panoramas of Avacha Bay, visit a fish market and souvenir shops.

HELICOPTER EXCURSION TO THE VALLEY OF THE GEYSERS

Duration: 7 – 8 hours

Indicative Price: US\$1,000 per person (18 seater) US\$1,700 per person (2 seater)

Transport: Helicopter Grade: Easy

Description: Visit world famous Valley of the Geysers Nature Park and Caldera of Uzon Volcano by helicopter

Discovered in 1941, the Valley of the Geysers is a beautiful and rare natural phenomenon, which has the second largest concentration of geysers in the world. This unique valley is difficult to reach, with helicopters providing the only feasible means of transport.

You will be picked up from your hotel and transferred to the helicopter pad near Elizovo to board the waiting helicopter. It will take over an hour to get to the Valley of the Geysers. During the flight you will be able to enjoy gerial views of active and extinct volcanoes, mountain ranges, taiga, rivers and lakes. Of particular interest are two volcanoes – Karymsky (1486m) which is very active (if you are lucky you may see a small eruption) and Maly Semyachik (1560m) which has an acid lake in its crater. After landing there will be a guided walk to view some of the more than 20 big geysers in the valley including Velican (Giant), Zhemchuzhny (Pearly), Fontan (Fountain) and Shchel (Split). Some geysers gush every 10-12 minutes while others may erupt once every 4-5 hours.

In June 2007 a massive mudflow covered the Valley of the Geysers blocking a small river which caused a thermal lake to form in the valley, but the waters have receded since then to expose some of the submerged features. Velikan (Giant), one of the field's largest geysers was not buried in the mudflow and has recently been observed to be active. The extent of permanent change from the mudflow is not yet clear, but the Valley of the Geysers looks a lot different now than prior to the event. However it still remains one of the most spectacular natural wonders in Russia. The wreathes of steam, fountains of boiling water, incredible colours of slopes, hot water streaming along them and profuse greenery of grasses and trees create an enchanting spectacle. There is a range of walking options in the valley.

As this excursion is operated by helicopter, favourable weather conditions and minimum numbers are required.

PETROPAVLOVSK-KAMCHATSKIY PRE CRUISE BIRDING EXTENSION – EXTENDED

Description: Birding Petropavlovsk-Kamchatskiy

This full day tour is available in conjunction with the Russia's Ring of Fire expedition departure only, it offers the opportunity to experience bird species in town and in the forests close to Petropavlovsk-Kamchatskiy. You may want to start with an early morning walk to a site near the hotel where it is possible to view Lanceolated Warbler, Middendorff's Grasshopper Warbler and the Siberian Rubythroat.

After breakfast we visit the forests near the village of Paratunka about 40 minutes drive west of the hotel. There are a number of species to look for here including the Grey Bunting, Rustic Bunting and Rufous-tailed Robin. Other species include the Olive-backed Pipit and the Common Rosefinch. From Paratunka we travel to Forest Lake where highlights could include Eye-browed Thrush, Siberian Rubythroat, Three-toed Woodpecker, Kamchatka Leafwarbler, Common Rosefinch and Asian Brown Flycatcher. At a small roadside lake on the way back to Petropavlovsk-Kamchatskiy we might be rewarded with views of Blackheaded Gull, Common Tern and Greater Scaup and Falcated Ducks.

PETROPAVLOVSK-KAMCHATSKIY PRE CRUISE BIRDING EXTENSION

Date: 27 May 2015

Duration: 9 hours, pick up from Hotel Petropavlovsk 0600 (min:12 max:20)

Description: Birding Petropavlovsk-Kamchatskiy

After an early morning pick-up from the Hotel Petropavlovsk, we head out of town to visit the Khlamovitsky Reserve. On the way there is a chance to see the Rough-legged Buzzard as this species is reasonably numerous in the area. The reserve comprises of a large marsh and if conditions allow, we will walk out to an area where gulls and terns breed. The biggest attraction is the possibility of finding Aleutian Tern. This species only breeds here in very small numbers and does not seem to be present every year. Both Black-headed Gulls and Common Terns breed at the reserve in reasonable numbers and whilst the gulls are the same as in Western Europe, the Common Terns are of the subspecies longipennis which is distinctly different from the birds most people will be familiar with as they have jet black bills. There are a selection of waders which also breed here with the possibilities including both Long-toed Stint and Far Eastern Curlew. At the end of the half day excursion this tour returns to the hotel and is followed by a transfer to the ship in the afternoon for commencement of the voyage.

KAMCHATKA DOG SLEDDING ADVENTURE "SNOW DOGS"

Duration: 3 hours

Indicative Price: US\$560 per person

Grade: Easy Transport: Vehicle

Description: Introduction to indigenous culture and dog sledding

This excursion offers a great opportunity to interact with natives of the Kamchatka region and learn about their culture.

The 'Snow Dogs' kennel lodge is operated by the native community of smaller people of the Kamchatsky region, 'The Children of the North' which was founded for revival and development of traditional dog sledding. The lodge grounds have been arranged as an ethnic style village and will introduce you to the culture of indigenous peoples of Kamchatka such as the Koryak and Itelmen. The lodge is located beside a small lake and from the lawn spectacular views of the Koryakskiy and Avachinskiy Volcanoes can be admired. The hosts will share the history of the aboriginal people with you and present a colourful local ethnic dance programme. During the presentation you will have the opportunity to learn the basic movements of the national dance.

Later we will learn about the history of the Kamchatka Sled Dogs breed, hear stories about the sport of dog sledding and traditional Arctic and Kamchatka sled breeding. Your hosts will show you how to harness sled dogs, outline the training process and talk about how to care for the dogs.

You may also have the opportunity to take part in a traditional crafts master-class and play some traditional games. There will be unique opportunities to be photographed in traditional costumes, ride horses and become acquainted with the lifestyle and living conditions of the indigenous peoples of Kamchatka. Guests may also be invited to try some hot, fragrant Ukha soup and other traditional foods before being transferred back to the hotel.

MUTNOVSKIY VOLCANO

Duration: 7 – 8 hours

Description: Take a closer look at the Mutnovskiy Volcano and

experience its large craters, glacier and beauty

Mutnovsky Volcano (2323m), situated 70km south of Petropavlovsk-Kamchatskiy, is considered to be one of the most beautiful places in Kamchatka. This giant is calm now, but showed its power 15 times in the last century. The entire massif comprises of four volcanic cones and has two craters. The first crater, called 'Central' stretches over an area of 2 x 1.5km. Here one can see different displays of volcanic activity, with beautiful blues and yellows dramatically colouring the scene and one slope covered with an impressive glacier. Due to the volcanic activity some parts of the glacier have melted and a volcanic lake has appeared. The second crater is smaller but shows strong fumarole activity.

The last eruption at Mutnovsky took place in 2000, but even in quiet periods, the volcano excretes a large amount of energy in the form of fumarole gases and numerous powerful thermal springs. This is one of the largest geothermal deposits in the world.

KURILSKOYE LAKE - THE 'KINGDOM OF BEARS'

Description: Watch bears on the shores of one of the most beautiful lakes in the world

Option only available following Jewel of the Russian Far East due to presence of bears

Lake Kurilskoye is located on the southern tip of the 1,000km long Kamchatka Peninsula in an area surrounded by pristine wilderness. A large bird colony occupies a small rocky island called 'Alaid's Heart' (because it bears a strong resemblance to the human heart) in the southern part of the lake. The lake was formed according to different estimations 8-50 thousands years ago and fills a giant volcanic caldera covering an area of 9 x 12km with a depth of over 300m. If weather conditions permit, we will take a cruise on the lake to Alaids' Heart and North Bay.

This lake is famous for being one of the largest salmon spawning areas in Kamchatka. Spawning lasts from August until November and reaches its highest point in October. During this period one can see a lot of large and small animals appearing along the lakeshore. The fish also attract Kamchatka's huge brown bears, so a special safe viewing tower has been built for visitors to observe the fascinating scenes of bears fishing in their natural habitat. The best time to view bears is late August to October.

On the way back to Petropavlovsk-Kamchatskiy we will visit a hot spring and enjoy further opportunities to view the picturesque Kamchatka Peninsula from the air.

As this excursion is operated by helicopter it is subject to favourable weather conditions and minimum numbers.

YUZHNO-SAKHALINSK CITY TOUR

Description: City tour of Yuzhno-Sakhalinsk

Both the 2 and 3 hour city tour options include a visit to an Orthodox Church, city squares, souvenir shops and Gagarin Park of Culture and Leisure. Opened in 1947 this park covers an area of 90ha and is a popular leisure centre where many local birds can be seen and heard. On the eastern corner of the park there is a trail leading to the top of a hill where nice views over the city and surrounding area can be enjoyed.

The 3 hour city tour also includes entrance to the pagoda roofed Regional Museum of Local Lore and History. This is the best museum in the city and the building was home to the Karafuto administration before the USSR seized the island from the Japanese in 1945. The museum has three floors and exhibits hundreds of local items belonging to the aboriginal people of Sakhalin Island from both the Japanese and Russian period.

BIRDING SAKHALIN

Date: 8 June 2015 **Duration:** 10 hours

Description: Birdina

The island of Sakhalin at approximately 600 miles long is the largest in the Russian Far East. Many exciting birds can be found here, including several which we are unlikely to see on the main expedition. On this short excursion we will concentrate on looking for two of the most range restricted bird species, the Sakhalin Leaf-Warbler and Sakhalin Warbler.

Our excursion begins when we disembark from the Spirit of Enderby shortly after the vessel arrives alongside the wharf. The intention is to keep the itinerary flexible to maximize on our birding opportunities but we plan to start the day by visiting an area of woodland not too far from the Port of Korsakov where we will look for Sakhalin Leaf-Warbler. Although this Phylloscopus warbler breeds on the Southern Kuril Islands, it appears to be rather rare there but we stand a good chance of finding it this morning, with other possibilities including Pacific Swift, Oriental Turtle Dove, Red-flanked Bluetail, Narcissus Flycatcher and Lanceolated Warbler.

During the afternoon, we plan to head to a park a short distance from the hotel in Yuzhno-Sakhalinsk where we will look for Sakhalin Warbler. Although this bird is sometimes 'lumped' with Gray's Grasshopper Warbler, recent studies suggest it should probably be given full species status. We will aim to find this bird although its skulking nature means getting good views can be a challenge. This park is also an excellent location for another tricky speciality, the Rufous-tailed Robin. We stand a good chance of finding this bird here as well as a range of other species including Japanese Pygmy Woodpecker, Asian House Martin and Pallas's Leaf-warbler. Depending on the weather, the park can be alive with migrants and on occasions, we have seen four species of flycatcher here – Dark-sided, Asian Brown, Taiga and Narcissus, so we will hope to end the extension in the late afternoon with a nice selection of Siberian specialities.


Description: Climb a hill to see a famous rock formation

A mini bus will transport us from Yuzhno-Sakhalinsk to the village of Vestochka. From there we will walk the up the slope of Mt Gorbunova and take the steep but short climb to the top of 'Frog Rock'. In good weather climbers are rewarded with beautiful views of the Korsakov Plato, Anivsky Creek, Lake Tunaicha and Lake Izmenchivoe. Once all participants have descended the rock, we will return to the vehicle and drive back to Yuzhno-Sakhalinsk.

MAGADAN CITY TOUR

Duration: 3 - 4 hours

Transport: Car/Walk Grade: Easy/Moderate

Description: City tour of Magadan, including Regional Museum

After being picked up from your hotel, we commence this tour at a popular viewing point that looks out over Nagaev Bay. The original town of Magadan was originally named after this bay in 1928. From here we proceed to the 'Mask of Sorrow' Monument which was built in 1996 as a memorial to the victims of the Gulags. This monument is testimony to the history of the region and consists of a large concrete statue of a face with tears coming from the left eye in the form of small masks. The right eye is in the form of a barred window. The back of the mask portrays a young woman weeping and a headless man on a cross. Inside the mask is a replica of a typical Stalin-era prison cell. Below the 'Mask of Sorrow' are stone markers which bear the names of many of the forced-labour camps of the Kolyma, as well as others designating the various religions and political systems of those who suffered there. From the hill on which this monument is built there are great views over Magadan, Nagaev Bay and the Sea of Okhotsk.

Later we will visit the Magadan Regional Museum of Local Lore, one of the largest scientific/educational institutions in the Russian Far East. It has an extensive display devoted to

the Kolyma Gulags with many artefacts from them. Exhibit rooms contain historic information on the notorious Kolyma Gulags and Dalstroy (the administration of the Gulags), the natural history of the Russian Far-East, the impact of World War II in this region and geological information on local rocks.

After the museum visit there will be an opportunity to return to your hotel to change and freshen up before rejoining the tour for a special meal. We join a local family in their home to experience an authentic Magadan lunch or dinner, a delicious meal based on local products collected or grown in and around the region. This will be an opportunity to try products such as crabs, trumpeter, local halibut, salmon and home-made berry juice.





FLIGHTS

Moscow, the main gateway into Russia from Europe and the USA, has three main airports – Domodedovo (airport code DME), Sheremeyyevo (airport code SVO) and Vnukovo (airport code VKO). They are many miles apart so plenty of time is required if you need to transfer between them. Those travelling from the southern hemisphere will probably fly via Asia, entering Russia through Vladivostok or Khabarovsk. Russian airlines generally do not to release their domestic flight schedules until between six and three months before our departure dates. We realise that this can be frustrating, so Heritage Expeditions offers charter flights from Nome, Alaska, which connect with most voyages originating and terminating in Anadyr and will suggest flight itineraries to other cities as details become available.

TRANSFERS

A complimentary transfer is provided to the ship from the airport and central city on embarkation day, and vice versa on disembarkation. The only exception to this is when the ship arrives in Magadan when only a port to city transfer is available. Passengers should not book onward flights until the following day and transfers are available at additional cost. We do encourage travellers however to arrive at least one day prior to embarkation to explore and settle into the new time zone to maximise the expedition experience. If direct flights from Moscow to Anadyr arrive on the day the expedition begins, those are the flights we recommend for a seamless transfer to the vessel. If you would like to spend more time in Anadyr we strongly recommend pre-booking a transfer from the airport to the town as all passengers arriving in the strictly controlled border region of Chukotka will be closely scrutinised. Transfers on days other than embarkation and disembarkation are available at additional cost. Please refer to the suggested hotels for a guide to transfer prices which will be confirmed at the time of enquiry.
