Western Pacific Odyssey Checklist 2023

Introduction

With the exception of a few vagrants, this checklist lists almost all the species which have been seen on previous Western Pacific Odysseys. A number of other birds which have not been recorded previously, but remain possible, are also included along with the species we hope to encounter on our stops in New Zealand.

In recent years, it has become increasingly apparent that the conventional species-level taxonomy for this region needs revising, and in *Birds of Melanesia* (2011) Guy Dutson made a number of splits which have been adopted in this checklist. Otherwise, the English names generally follow the *IOC's World Bird List*, with revisions made where an alternative name is considered more appropriate.

Species status

This column lists the threat status for each species as recommended by the Birdlife International/IUCN Red List. The following codes have been used:

- LC least concern
- NT near threatened
- VU vulnerable
- EN endangered
- CR critically endangered
- DD data deficient

[] – where the code is bracketed, the "species" is not currently recognised as a valid species by the Birdlife International/IUCN Red List.

Area(s) of occurrence

All species which were seen on one or more previous voyages/ recces have a non-bracketed code in the 'area of occurrence' column:

- PV at sea
- NZ New Zealand
- NI Norfolk Island
- NC New Caledonia
- ND Nendo, Solomon Islands
- MK Makira, Solomon Islands
- HO Guadalcanal, Solomon Islands
- TP Tetepare, Solomon Islands
- KO Kolombangara, Solomon Islands
- CH Chuuk, Micronesia
- HJ Hachijo-jima, Izu Islands, Japan

Where the code is bracketed, this indicates an island where a species can be found but it has not been seen there previously.

Likelihood

All the birds in the checklist (except on islands which are new to the WPO) have been given a star rating to indicate how likely we are to encounter a particular species:

* An excellent chance of seeing this species, which has been seen in good numbers previously. One-star seabirds generally have a reasonably large distribution (i.e. they can be expected for at least several days or much longer in some cases), and land birds have either previously been seen in reasonable numbers on more than one island or are very common if a single-island endemic.

- ** A good chance of seeing this species, although less frequently encountered than one-star birds. This category includes seabirds which have more restricted distributions but have been seen on most/all previous voyages, although generally in only small numbers and/or often on only one or two days. Two-star land birds are uncommon and in most cases have only been seen in small numbers on one or two islands.
- ** A rare species on the WPO itinerary. Three-star birds have
- either not been seen on all voyages or been seen in only very small numbers. Land birds included in this category are likely to have been seen only by a percentage of the group.
- ** A species which generally has not been seen on a previous
- ** voyage but is included due to its range. A small percentage were seen on a recce (eg Woodford's Rail) or on a previous expedition but we would be extremely lucky to see these on WPO 2023.

Taxonomic notes

Beck's Petrel – In some older seabird reference books, Beck's Petrel is either barely mentioned or is lumped with Tahiti Petrel.

Following inconclusive views of a bird off Bougainville on the first WPO (2007) which was considered to be probably a Beck's Petrel, Hadoram Shirihai announced in early 2008 that he had rediscovered this species.

Since then, Beck's Petrel has been seen on all subsequent WPO expeditions and DNA work has confirmed that this is indeed a valid species, albeit one which is closely related to Tahiti Petrel.

Beck's Petrel has only ever been seen off Bougainville and New Ireland on previous WPOs. It is significantly smaller than Tahiti Petrel (although this can be difficult to appreciate on a lone bird), with a very different 'jizz'/structure and flight pattern.

Fiji Petrel – Small, all-dark petrels were seen by some of the group on WPOs 2007, 2008 and 2010 in the general vicinity of Bougainville/New Ireland, and others have had similarly frustrating experiences during research in this area.

While these birds may be Fiji Petrels, it seems not inconceivable that an unknown all-dark petrel exists in these waters, given how little is known about the seabirds of this region; eg the breeding grounds of Heinroth's Shearwater are still to be located and Beck's Petrel was only rediscovered in 2007.

Vanuatu Petrel – This species (which resembles a small Whitenecked Petrel) was described in 2001 with the work entirely based on specimens. Until relatively recently, almost nothing was known about this bird in life, however, it is now known that the species breeds on Vanua Lava in the Banks Islands.

Birds which are considered to have been Vanuatu Petrels have now been seen on a number of WPO voyages, however, separating this species from White-necked Petrel remains challenging without photos. **Magnificent Petrel** – This taxon was described in 2010 in the Bulletin of the British Ornithologists' Club by Hadoram Shirihai and Vincent Bretagnolle.

Although the birds are very similar to dark-morph Collared Petrels, they differ through a "combination of smaller size, with shorter wings but relatively longer tail, and shorter bill and tarsus".

The authors state that they "tentatively" treat Magnificent Petrel as a subspecies of Collared Petrel; however, they suggest it is "at least as distinctive as many other recognised races and even species of petrels" and further work may lead to it being given "species status". The paper states that HS has seen Magnificent Petrels 150 km west of the Banks Islands (Vanuatu) and since the original paper it has been established that the birds breed on Vanua Lava Island in northern Vanuatu.

Given that HS's at-sea sightings are only a couple of hundred nautical miles from our route between New Caledonia and the Solomon Islands, it seems highly likely that this taxon does occur along the route of the WPO.

That said, the paper states that the authors are not convinced there are any "absolute diagnostic characters to separate it at sea" from dark Collared Petrels, although about 40% of *magnificens* are an even darker grey than dark Collared Petrels with "uniformly very dark underparts and much of the underwing, with a limited area of pure white on the innermost coverts and the larger row of median coverts, and a small white throat". Other features described for separating it from Collared Petrel are the "distinctive structure, with relatively short wings but a proportionately long pointed tail". The authors also note that this taxon has a very distinctive flight pattern with birds "habitually [flying] very low, with short and low (steep) banks and arcs, long and very low glides, often with sudden sharp turns" and they suggest this, plus the shape, are good ways of distinguishing Magnificent Petrel from Collared Petrel.

It is worth noting that a very dark 'Collared Petrel' which was flying in the above manner, eg with very tight turns low over the water, was seen on WPO 2010 (in Australian waters south of New Caledonia) and it is now believed this bird was a Magnificent Petrel and, if accepted, this would be the first record for Australia. Other birds have been seen and photographed on a number of subsequent expeditions which are considered to have also been this taxon.

Melanesian and Micronesian Shearwaters – In recent years, taxonomic work has identified that a number of the shearwater populations which had previously been included within the Audubon's and Little Shearwater complex should be treated as full species, e.g. Tropical Shearwater, Bannerman's Shearwater, Galapagos Shearwater, Bryan's Shearwater etc.

Knowledge of the species boundaries in this group is, however, far from complete and it seems highly likely that further species and subspecies will eventually be described. For example, there is a seemingly undescribed subspecies of 'Tropical Shearwater' along the route of the WPO which is presumed to breed in the Solomon Islands (per M. Carter, Australia), and there are two populations of 'Little Shearwater' on Norfolk Island. One of these breeds in the winter and the other in the summer. Structurally they are so distinct that different-sized leg rings are required (per M. Christian, Norfolk Island) when they are being ringed/banded, yet they are currently regarded as the same subspecies.....

In this checklist we have decided to differentiate two of the populations of 'Tropical Shearwaters' and following the proposal in "Oceanic Birds of the World: A Photo Guide" by Howell and Zufelt have used the names 'Melanesian Shearwater' and 'Micronesian Shearwater' for the birds we are likely to see on this voyage. It is anticipated, however, that even this may be a simplification of the taxonomy.

New Caledonian Storm-Petrel – a storm-petrel which closely resembled New Zealand Storm-Petrel ('NZSP') was first seen off the coast of New Caledonia on WPO 2008 with sightings on several subsequent voyages. Since then, similar birds have also been recorded off Australia on multiple occasions.

Whilst the birds were somewhat distant during the early WPO encounters, those on WPO 2012 enjoyed some excellent views and this supported the suspicion outlined in a paper published by Steve Howell and Chris Collins (2008) that the bird appeared too large for NZSP.

Subsequent work has now proved that these birds are indeed the long lost '*Pealea lineata*', a species known from a single specimen collected in Samoa in the 19th Century and a paper published in 2022 by Hadoram Shirihai, Vincent Bretagnolle et al has now confirmed this, although the birds are now considered to be *Fregetta*.

Norfolk Island Whistler – The 'Golden Whistler' complex is undoubtedly one of the best examples in the West Pacific where further taxonomic study is likely to result in many new species being recognised.

Whilst Guy Dutson (*Birds of Melanesia*) started this process by treating the whistlers on Rennell and in the rest of the Solomons as two species separate from Golden Whistler (i.e. Rennell Whistler and Oriole Whistler), he also noted that the taxonomy for other subspecies is "unsettled" and suggested that it is likely that other species will be recognised.

Although his book does not cover Norfolk Island, the 'subspecies' which occurs there is surely one of the more extreme inclusions within the Golden Whistler complex, as the males do not have any black and bright yellow in their plumage and look similar to females, i.e. are a comparatively uniform pale grey-brown.

If Rennell Whistler and Oriole Whistler are regarded as full species, it seems reasonable to treat the 'Norfolk Island Whistler' in the same way.
